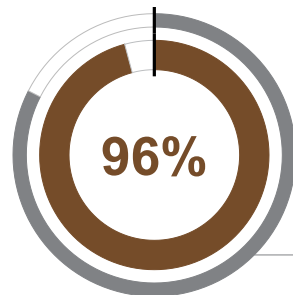
Special Note

Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

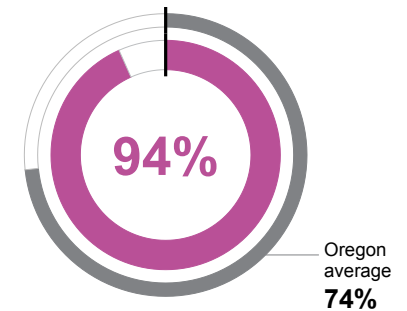

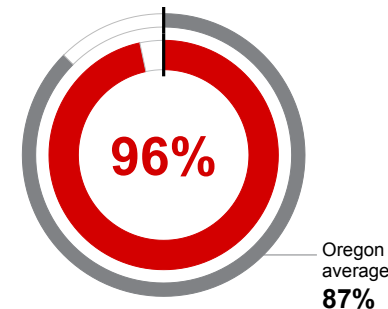
ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE

Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.



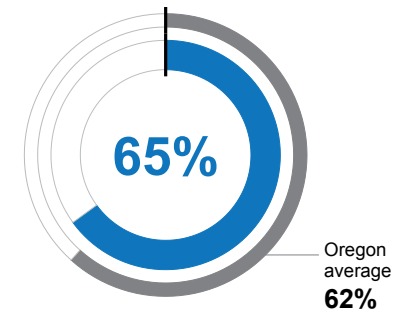
FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION

ADVANCED COURSEWORK

Summit Learning Charter takes great care to select engaging courses that meet all state and federal guidelines for academic content.
