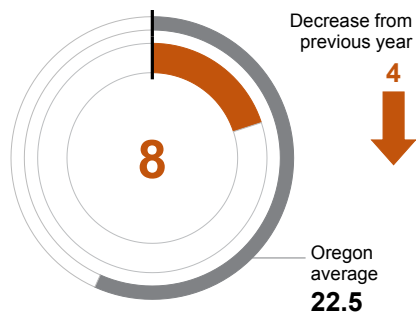

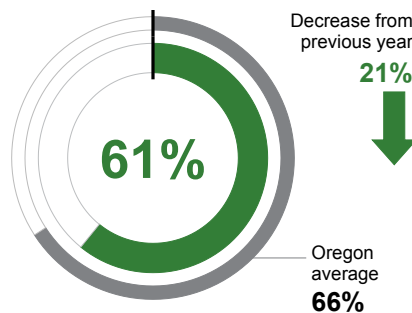
CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS

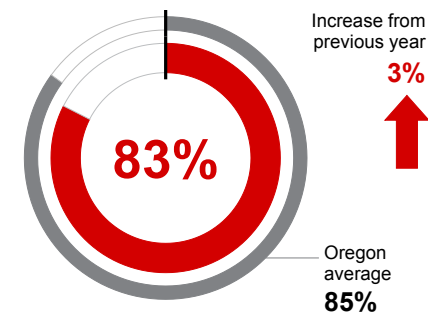

ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE

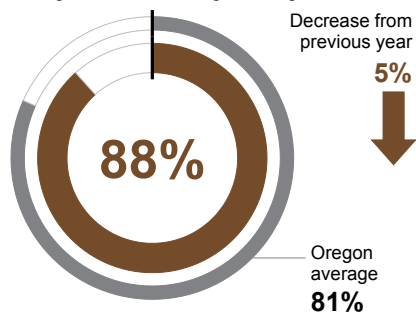
Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.

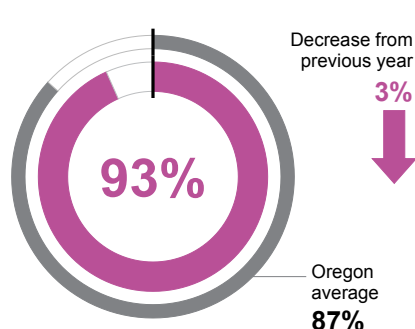
ON-TIME GRADUATION

Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2019-20 graduating in 2022-23.



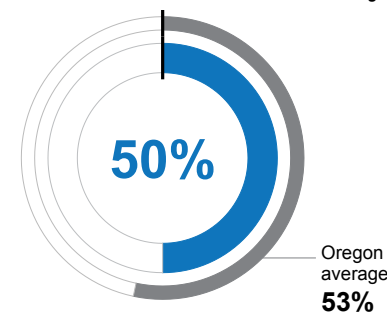
FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION

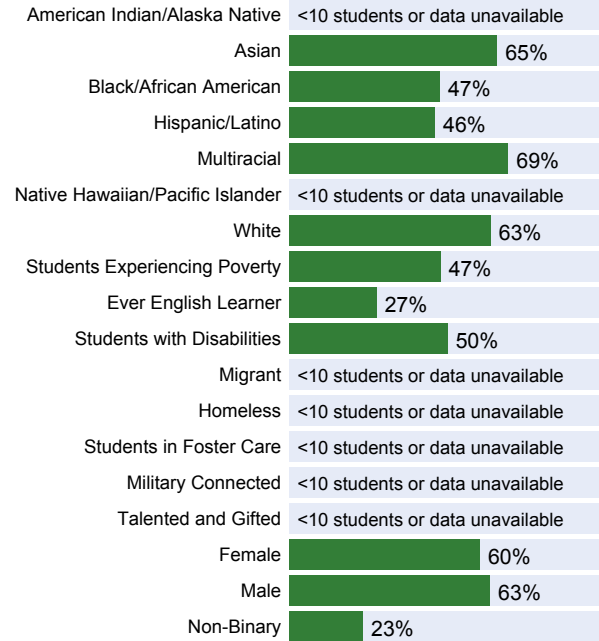

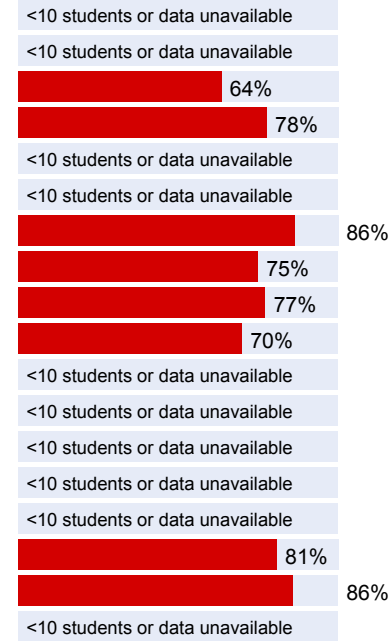

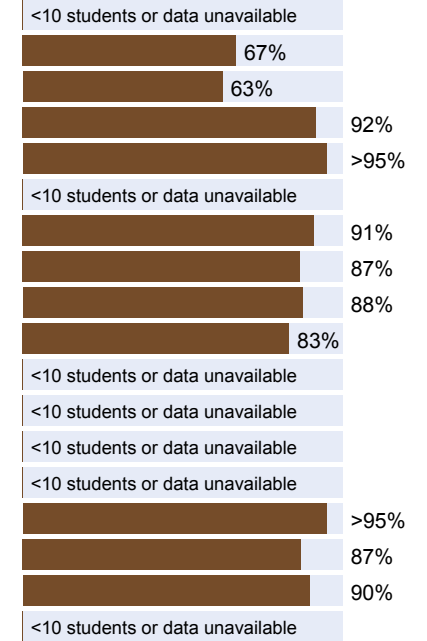

ADVANCED COURSEWORK

Summit Learning Charter takes great care to select engaging courses that meet all state and federal guidelines for academic content. Over 200 course titles from 3 curriculum sources personalize every student's schedule. Summit is extending existing relationships with local colleges to offer courses through our early college program.

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Many unique online CTE courses are available through our online curriculum options including agribusiness, animal systems business law, career explorations 1+2, career management, careers in health, corrections - policies and procedures, mental health counseling, early childhood development, engineering/design, engineering and innovation, environmental services, family / community services, food and beverage management, food products/processing, fundamentals of computers, digital media, programming/software development, intro to natural resources, hospitality, and IT support.
