Some tips for teaching your kids at home

Plan the day with your child

Even if you're following a lesson plan, it's good to brainstorm with your child about their day ahead so they have input about the routine.

Give them options. Ask them what they feel about doing tasks in certain ways. Give them time to adjust to the routine.

Involve the family

Have a chat with your family and know what their expectations are with the home school setup—and what is expected of them.

Assign your kid homework if they do not complete their school work during your scheduled time.
